

GRIEF SUPPORT

Rainbow Grief Support is one of the most important services we provide. Our bereavement counselors work closely with anyone who has experienced the loss of a loved one, whether on our hospice program or not.

Their outreach takes many forms including phone calls, one-on-one visits, facilitation of monthly or weekly support groups like *Monday Morning Joe* and hosting special programs like our annual Memorial Service or Holiday Grief events.



In 2022, we dedicated a beautiful, newly designed Memorial Garden outside our inpatient center. Anyone is welcome to visit the outdoor space to remember and honor the important people in their lives and gather for healing, reflection, and solitude.



COMMUNITY HEALTH MINISTRY

Rainbow Community Health Ministry is a program dedicated to collaborating with faith congregations to enhance the overall well-being of the community. Our Community Resource Liaison supports parish nurses, most of whom work on a volunteer basis, by completing tasks outside their area of expertise (e.g., conducting needs assessments, facilitating advance care planning conversations) and connecting parishioners with programs and resources that help meet critical needs.

FRIENDS IN ACTION

Core services provided by **Rainbow Friends in Action** include:

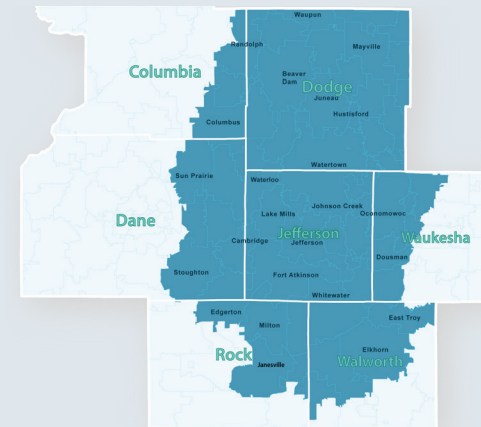
- Friendly visits

ADVANCE CARE PLANNING

Rainbow Advance Care Planning helps you learn about health care decisions that might need to be made during an emergency or at end-of-life, prepare for them ahead of time, and let others know your preferences. These wishes are put into a legal document known as an advance directive. It helps others know what type of medical care you want, allows you to express your values and name a health care agent (someone who can make decisions for you if you cannot do so yourself).

Good advance care planning starts with an important conversation with your loved ones about your healthcare wishes and is revisited when life circumstances change. Appropriate times to have this talk include when you begin each new decade of life, you are diagnosed with a serious illness, a loved one or health care agent passes, you get divorced, or you can no longer live on your own.



Rainbow currently participates in a statewide initiative called *Advance Care Planning & Advance Directive by the Wisconsin Medical Society*. Our team of advance care planning facilitators have been trained and certified by the nationally renowned Respecting Choices® First Steps® advance care planning program and is here to help you complete this important work.

PALLIATIVE CARE

Rainbow Palliative Care is a community-based palliative care program that helps seriously ill people and their caregivers manage the burdens associated with advancing chronic disease. Our specially trained team consisting of a Nurse Practitioner (NP), Nurse Navigator, and Social Worker visits patients wherever they call home versus making them come to us.



Like hospice, palliative care provides patients with relief from symptoms associated with their serious illness and also helps them plan for what might lie ahead. Unlike hospice, palliative care can be provided along with aggressive, life-prolonging treatment.

- Key benefits of **Rainbow Palliative Care** include:
- Visits in the home, assisted living facility, or nursing home
 - Nurse Navigator, Social Worker, and as needed Chaplain, Bereavement Counselor, and Dietitian
 - Relief from symptoms and stress
 - Collaboration and coordination of care with your primary care provider and specialists
 - Goals of care and treatment conversations
 - Completion of advance care planning documents
 - Education about your condition, medications, and changing care needs
 - Referral to other community-based resources
 - 24/7 access to RN telephone support and guidance

HOSPICE CARE

Rainbow Hospice Care supports terminally ill patients (i.e., people having six months or less to live) and their families. The primary goal of hospice care is to improve quality of life by providing care for the patient’s body, mind, spirit, soul, and relationships.

Our highly skilled interdisciplinary teams – *consisting of physicians, nurses, certified nursing assistants, social workers, chaplains, volunteers, and grief counselors* - ensure patients are free from distressing physical and emotional symptoms and work hard to give families an opportunity to complete important unfinished business in their lives.

Rainbow’s team makes regular visits to patients to develop plans of care that meet individual needs. They are on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Care can be provided wherever the patient lives – in their house or apartment, the assisted living facility or nursing home.

Hospice is not intended to replace whoever the patient’s primary caregiver is - whether that be family or facility staff. Instead, we are an extra set of minds, hands, eyes and ears who are there to work with caregivers to ensure that comfort and dignity are achieved.

Patients experiencing a significant medical crisis or families needing a break from the rigors of caregiving at home can also utilize the **Rainbow Hospice Care Inpatient Center**, a beautiful, home-like and state-of-the-art 8-bed facility located in Johnson Creek.
